Marc Weiser in the Sacramento Bee, October 2016 regarding the unimpaired flows proposal.

"In just two of the counties directly affected by the water board's proposal — Merced and Stanislaus — farmers irrigated about 110,000 acres of alfalfa in 2015. Alfalfa is California's thirstiest crop, and much of it is exported to feed livestock in other countries."

"If these two counties simply stopped growing alfalfa, it could free up a half-million acre-feet of water annually. The water board estimates its proposed streamflow increases will cost water users about half this amount."

- -Prevention of New Bird Nest Take Regulations Dept of Fish and Wildlife
- -Piecework Rule Safe Harbor

Reg. Improvements Continued

- -Prevention of Expansion Of Medical Leave SB 1166 (Jackson)
- -Defeat of SB 1317 (Wolk) placing a moratorium on new wells in critical basins
- -Flexibility in Reporting Diversions From Small Stockponds

SGMA

- *Local Control
- * Softened undesirable results language
- *2 years for governance, 5 years for plans and 20 year timeframe for sustainability
- *Already Adjudicated basins eligible to opt out
- * Protection of Groundwater and Surface Water Rights Language

- Food Safety Modernization Act
- EPA restrictions on Atrazine and Chlorpyrifos
- Affordable Care Act
- Other
